CALL FOR PAPERS. You, your colleagues, and students are invited to submit an abstract of a paper that you would like to have considered for presentation. Two copies of each abstract are to reach the section Chair by October 25, 1985. Abstracts should include the title of the paper, the name, title, professional affiliation, complete mailing address, and telephone number of the author(s). Student papers are encouraged and should be so identified.

CALL FOR PANELS AND SYMPOSIA. Panels and symposia may address differing points of view, timely issues, research interests, etc. Proposals should include topic, issues to be addressed, an abstract of the points of view, procedural format, the names, titles, and professional affiliations of the proposed participants, as well as the complete mailing address and telephone number of the leader.

PUBLICATION. You are encouraged to submit papers which are presented at the 1986 Annual Meeting for possible publication in the Michigan Academician, the quarterly interdisciplinary journal of the Academy. After presenting the materials in March 1986 at the meeting of the Academy, simply submit the manuscript prepared according to supplied directions at the information desk.
